





Declaration Day and Senior Survey Class of 2021



Vaccination Updates

With the approval of 12-15 years olds for the Pfizer vaccine, WTHS is announcing a mass vaccination clinic at the O'Plaine Campus on June 2 from 3:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m.

In addition, we will offer **sports physicals** for \$10! That is the cheapest price you can get a sports physical anywhere. They will be provided by Dr. Chams, the WTHS athletic team doctor.

Please complete the registration form for this vaccine, as there is a charge for it depending on insurance. Grab-and-Go Meals Summer Schedule



Pick up times are 10:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. and 3:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m.




USDA Food and Nutrition Service - National School Lunch or School Breakfast Program



Warren Township High School participates in the Summer Seamless Option, which is part of the National School Lunch or School Breakfast Program. This program provides free breakfast and free lunch for all children 18 years and younger.

The Seamless Summer Option makes it easier for school districts to provide meals to children during the traditional summer vacation periods and for year-round schools with long school vacation periods. WTHS has been approved to provide meals, free of charge, to all children 18 years old and younger. The District is then reimbursed by the USDA at the free rate for school lunches, school breakfasts and after school snacks.

Thank you to Quest Food Services for partnering with WTHS to provide meals for children in our community during the 2020-21 school year. Nearly 191,340 meals were distributed on Tuesdays and Thursdays at the Almond and O'Plaine campuses. Thank you to Liz Sharrock-Gilliland, Warren's food service director, for coordinating and overseeing this service.






